HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 19th of November laft, for prohibiting the Exportation or Carrying of Copper Coaftwife (except under the Rules and Regulations therein expressed) will expire on the 24th of this instant February; and it being judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, fo as that the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coaft-wife may continue to be reftrained, under the Rules and Regulations established in that Behalf ;-His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Ad-vice of His Privy Council, to order, that the said Prohibition be continued for Three Months, to commence from the 24th Day of this inftant Febru-ary; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure that the same shall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper to be Exported or fent Coastwife for His Majesty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Licence of the Commissioners of the Navy, nor to pre-vent the transporting or carrying Coastwife of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Foot Superficial) without any Security being re-- quired; nor to the exporting the fame to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which it may lawfully be exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain) upon Condition that all fuch Cop-per as is intended for Exportation shall be infpected and examined by an Agent or Agents, ap-pointed or to be appointed by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the said Agent or Agents, shall be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that no Part of the fame confilts of Plates of Copper, or Sheets of Copper (except as hereinafter excepted) or Nails made in whole or in Part of Copper, which can be made Use of for the Purpose of sheathing and coppering Ships or Vessels; which Certificate from the faid Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Port in which the faid Copper is intended to be fhipped, and fhall be their Authority for allowing the Quantity of Copper specified in the faid Certificate to be put on Board and exported — And as touching Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Foot Superficial, His Majefty is further pleafed to permit and allow the fame to be carried Coaftwife without any Refriction, provided that no greater Quantity than Ten Hundred Weight shall be laden on Board any one Ship. unlefs Security by Bond hath first been given, to the proper Officers of the Customs, in Fre-ble the Value of the Copper intended to be fent Coastwife, to carry the same to the Place proposed, and none other; and to produce and deliver a Cer-tificate or Certificates, within Four Months from the Date of the Bond, from the proper Officers of the

Cuftoms at the Ports for which fuch Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the fame having been all duly landed at such Ports; which Cer-tificate or Certificates such Officer is required to give, and the Commissioners of toms to transmit to the Lords Commissioners of His Majefly's Treafury, in order to be laid before this Board: And His Majefly is likewife pleafed to permit and allow the Exportation of Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two Pounds and an Half to the Ecot Superficial to any Paul and an Half to the Foot Superficial to any Parts be-yond the Seas, to which the fame may be lawfully exported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain,) upon Condition that no more than Ten Hundred Weight of fuch Copper shall be ex-ported by any one Person or Partnership, and that the Quantity laden or put on Board any one Ship or Veffel, fhall not exceed Three Tons in the whole; and also upon Condition that fuch Sheets of Copper shall be first inspected and examined by the Agent or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the Com-millioners of His Majefty's Navy; and that a Cer-tificate, under the Hand and Seal of fuch Agent or Agents shall be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that fuch Sheets of Copper are of and under the Weight above defcribed.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
