W Hereas the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Order in Council of the 19th of November last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this King-dom, or carrying Coastwile, Gunpowder, Salt-petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, vill expire on the 23d of this instant February: Ard whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prchibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Ule and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Veffels. employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September 1778, has shought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwife; Gunpow-der, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, here by order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever (except the Mafter-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majefly's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of

this inftant February, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or frip or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaffwife, except in the Cafes com-prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Council, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act "to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law. "for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the "Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to impower "His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife " His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwile " of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " or. Ammunition." — And the Lords Commif-fioners of His Majetty's Treafury, the Commif-lioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
