Abstract of a Letter from Breitenborg in Holstein
24 February, 1780.

NEWLY died Caspar Schramm, unmarried, at Dageling in this Territory of Breitenborg in Holstein, and his Inheritance is taken quickly under Indiciary Administration. Detleff Schramm, Brother in Law of this deceased Caspar Schramm, is his only Heir, if he is living still; or if he has lived after the same, he has transmitted the Inheritance upon his own next Heirs. This Detleff Schramm did go about 3 Years to Sea, and wrote to his Acquaintance (in a Letter, 1 April, 1779,) that he would sail from London to the East Sea; but in spite of all precedent Inquiring, it was impossible to discover, neither if he lives yet nor with what Ship and from what he travelled at last: Therefore the same Detleff Schramm, if he lives yet, is advertised hereby of the Death of his Brother in Law Caspar Schramm; likewise he is ordered hereby to come within a Year, and to receive prefitis prestandis this Inheritance: In case he should not come in the mean Time, it will be proceeded with this Inheritance according to the King's Law, and delivered the same, as soon as the loyal Time is finished, to the right Heirs for Property.
