HE following Address of the High Sheriff, Nobility, Grand Jury, and Inhabi-tants of the County of Fermanagh, having been transmitted by his Excellency the Earl of Buckinghamshire, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, to the Earl of Hillsborough, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to His Majesty: Which Address His Majefty was pleafed to receive very gracioufly.

The humble Address of the High Sheriff, Nobi-lity, Grand Jury, and Inhabitants, of the County of Fermanagh, allembled at Lent Affizes, 1780.

Most gracious Sovereign, W E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the High Sheriff, Grand Jury, and Inhabitants, of the County of Fermanagh, beg Leave to approach your Majefty, to lay at your Feet our most grateful Acknowledgments for the fignal Proof which your Majesty has lately afforded of your paternal Goodness and Attention to the Diftreffes of your faithful Subjects of Ireland, in the Participation of Trade with the British Settlements and Colonies, through your Majefty's most gracious Interpolition procured for this Kingdom; and we beg Leave also to affure your Majeffy we are truly, femible of the enlightened Policy and Liberality of Sentiment, which has disposed our Fellow-Subjects of Great Britain to admit us to a - Share of fuch great commercial Advantages. And we feel great Pleafure in the Reflection, that thereby the Union-between both Kingdoms, which we are fully convinced is infeparable from their Interests, will be more strongly cemented ; and that from thence weishall be the better enabled to indulge the ardent Defire which we must ever have to use our utmost En-deavours to maintain the Honour and Dignity of your Majesty's Crown, and to add to the Strength, Power, and Authority, of the British Empire.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October, 1776, to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds. Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, firfor His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fach Able and Ordinary Seaman, 'not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the 'Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31 ft of December then follow-ing, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majelty's Royal Ing, enter themfetves to lerve in His Majelty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majelty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Roard fuch Tenders as Hould be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majelty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promife and declare, That a Re-ward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirry Shillings for eveny Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seaman who might secrete themselves, that to such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Ser-Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Ser-vide, by any of His Majesty's Sea=Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the 31st Day of De-ceapber, 1776: And whereas His Majesty was like-wile pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August 1777, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter him... felt to serve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships. 1 of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter him. felf to ferve on Board any of His Majefty's Ships, on or before the gift Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majefty's' Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty'Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed': And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Pay-ment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the gift Day of this inflant March; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and His Majesty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time

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
