CHARLES Town in South Carolina being restored to the King's Possession, the direct Intercourse between Great Britain and the Southern Provinces of North America through that Town will be renewed, and a Packet will sail every Month from Falmouth, as formerly. The first Mail will be dispatched from this Office on the 5th of July next, being the First Wednesday in the Month.
