

Pursuant to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, the next of Kin and Children of the next of Kin of Gabriel Henderson, (Son of William Henderson) formerly of Kirkcaldy in the County of Fife, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and afterwards of Bombay in the East Indies, Mariner, deceased, who were living at the Time of his Death, are to come in and make out such their Relationship to the said Testator, before Edward Leeds, Esq; one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers in Lincoln's-inn, London, or in Default thereof they will be excluded the Benefit of the said Decree.
