Hereas a great Number of diforderly Perfons have for feveral Days past affembled themfelves together, in a Riotous and Tumultuous Manner, and nave been guilty of many Acts of Treason, Rebellion. and Felony, having formed Defigns to break open and deftroy the Gaols and Prilons, and to fet loofe the Priloners confined therein, and having actually broke into and fet on Fire the Gaol of Newgate, the King's Bench Prifon, and the Prifon of the Fleet, and released the Prisoners, and made Attempts on other Gaols and Prifons in and about this Metropolis; and having fet Fire to and pulled down the Dwelling-houses of divers of Our peaceable Subjects, and also fet Fire to, burnt and de-stroyed the Materials thereof, and the Furniture and other Effects found therein; and also taken Money from divers of Our Subjects: We there-fore, taking the fame into Our most ferious Confideration, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish and declare Our Resolution, That the Authors, Abettors, and Perpetrators of the faid Offences be profecuted as expeditionally as may be, according to the due Courfe of Law; and we do hereby enjoin and require all Jufices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, and all other Our loving Subjects, to be aiding and affifting to the utmost of their Power, in detecting, apprehend-ing and bringing to Justice the faid Offenders. And We are graciously pleased to promile, that if any Person shall discover any other Person or Perfont who are guilty of any of the faid Offences, fo as that the Person or Persons discovered may be profecuted for the fame, fuch Difcoverer shall have and receive, as a Reward, upon Conviction of fuch Offender or Offenders, the Sum of FIF'TY POUNDS, and also Our Gracious Pardon for the faid Offence, in Cafe the Perfon making fuch Difcovery fhall himfelf be liable to be profecuted for the fame; and the Commiffioners for Executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the faid Rewards.

HEREAS Information has been received, that the late Biote and T that the late Riots and Tumults in and about this Metropolis were encouraged and abetted by Money, or other Kewards, given, or promifed to be given, to the Perfons concerned therein; and alfo Bells, Flags, and other Signals and Devices, were used during the faid Riots and Tumults, to direct the Rioters in their Criminal Acts and Proceedings, and to give Notice of Attempts or Preparations to fupprefs, refuit, or interrupt the fame : We therefore, taking the fame into Our molt ferious Confi-deration, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Perfons guilty of any of the Criminal Acts above mentioned, are graciously pleased to promile, That if any Perfon shall discover any other Person or Perfons, who by themfelves, or their Agents, gave or offered, or promifed to give, any Money, or other Reward, to any Perfon or Perfons, to engage or continue in the faid Riots or Tumults, or to do or affift in any of the Criminal Acts committed during the Continuance of the faid Riots and Tu-

mults, or who made use of any Bells, Flags, or other Signals or Devices; to direct the Rioters in any of their Criminal Acts and Proceedings, or to give Notice of Attempts or Preparations to inpprefs; resist, or interrupt the same, to es that the Person or Persons discovered may be prosecuted, such Dilcoverer shall have and receive as a Reward, upon Conviction of such Offender or Offenders, the Sum of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS; and the Commissioners for executing the Office of Treasurer of Our Exchequer are hereby required to make Payment thereof accordingly.
