P R E S E N T, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W Hereas the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 10th of May laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this King-dom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this inflant August: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Pro-bibition formid by another that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Continued for iome 1 me longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Be-nefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Ufe and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Veffels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1977, of the rth and 10th of and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April; the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of Octo-ber, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September, 1778, and of the 17th of May last, has thought proper to permit and allow the Ex-portation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gunpow-der, Saltpetré, Arms and Ammunition, under tertain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majety doth therefore, by the faid Orders: His Majefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, here-by order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever (except the Mafter-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majefly's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this inftant August, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gun powder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Am-munition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carry-ing the same Coastwife, except in the Cases coming the fame Coaftwife, except in the Cafes com-prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act "to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Ex-"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law "for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower "His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife " His Majetty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife \*\* of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms
