

St. James's, September 23, 1780.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Saturday the Twelfth Day of August last, between Twelve and One o'Clock in the Morning, some malicious Person or Persons unknown did wilfully set Fire to an Oat Stack, the Property of the Reverend Mr. Brindley, of Rugeley in the County of Stafford, which in a few Minutes was consumed, together with about Eighty Tons of Hay and Clover, a new Waggon, Two Carts, a Set of Gearing for Six Horses, and various Implements of Husbandry; and likewise a large Quantity of Corn, with a Barn, Shed and Hovel, belonging to George Anson, Esq;

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in setting Fire to the Effects and Premises above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person who actually set Fire thereto) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
