And, as a farther Encouragement, His Majesty is bereby pleased to offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person who shall apprebend, or cause to be apprebended, any one or more of the Persons concerned in the Offences above-mentioned, to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury upon the Conviction sf any one or more of the faid Offenders.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st Day of January, to the 30th of June, 1780, according to His Majesty's Establishment in that Behalf: These are to give Notice, that the faid Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office of the Treasurer of the Navy in Broad-Street, on Monday the 27th and Tuesday the 28th Instant, at Ten of the Clock in the Morning, wix. THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majefy's Navy do hereby give Notice, that they are ready to treat for Ships of 200 Tons and upwards, to serve as Transports and Victuallers.
