HE King has been pleased to present the Rev. Mr. Hugh M'Diarmot to the Church and Parish of Comrie, in the Presbitery of Auchterader and Shire of Perth, valant by the Death of Mr. Robert Menzies.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Outrages above-mentioned, is bereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually discharged the said Pistols) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

Evered doth hereby promise a Reward of TWENTY POUNDS, and the Parish of Great Saxham afore-said do also promise an additional Reward of TWENTY POUNDS, to any Person making such Discovery as above mentioned (except as before excepted) to be paid upon the Conviction of any one or more of the said Offenders.
