

have therefore been pleased to resolve, that so long as the Trade of Our Subjects shall continue to be secured in those Seas, Our Ships of War, Privateers, and other Vessels acting under Our Commission, shall be restrained from making Prize of, stopping, or detaining any Ship or Vessels within the Baltic: And We do hereby strictly charge and enjoin the Commanders of Our Ships of War, and the Commanders of all Ships and Vessels having Letters of Marque and Reprizal, that they do not, by virtue of their Commissions, or under Colour thereof, stop or detain any Ship or Vessel in the Baltic, for the Purpose of making Prize of the same, but that they suffer all such Ships and Vessels as they shall meet in those Seas to proceed in their respective Voyages, without any Interruption.
