St. James's, December 21, 1781.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on the 28th ult. Christopher Bell, Supervisor of Excise, at Saxmundham in Suffolk, assisted by Four Excise Officers, and Twenty Soldiers of the Suffolk Militia, made Seizure of a considerable Quantity of Rum, Spirits and Tea; and that in about Ten Minutes after making the said Seizure, a large Gang of Ruffians, armed with Bludgeons and loaded Whips, attacked the said Supervisor and Officers, beating them in a most cruel Manner, particularly the Supervisor, whose left Arm was thereby fractured in two Places, after which they refused the said Seizure.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the Offenders, (except the Person or Persons who actually beat and wounded the said Supervisor) who shall discover any one or more of his Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

of Excise do hereby promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as abovementioned, (except as before excepted) to be paid by their Secretary on the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
