Hereas His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 5th Day of October, 1776, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Sea man, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31th of December then follow ing, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of No. vember, 1776, to promife and declare, That a Reward of Iwo Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might secrete themselves, that so such Seaman or Seamen thould be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for railing Men, on or before the 31st Day of December, 1776: And whereas His Majetty was like-wife pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August, 1777, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-sive, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter himself to serve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next,
