HAVE the Pleasure to acquaint you, for the La-formation of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the 20th Inftant, Ufhant bearing N. E. half E.'23 Leagues, at One P. M. I perceived the Artois, Captain Macbride, with a Signal out for difcovering an Enemy's Fleet, but at fuch a Diffance that it was with the utmost Difficulty I could diffinguish the Colour of the Flag : It was then calm, but
