The Address of the Irish Parliament having disclaimed any Power or Authority, of any Sort whatsoever, in the Parliament of Great Britain over this Realm, we shall confider an unqualified and unconditional Repeal of the Statute the Sixth of George the First, by the British Parliament, made in Purfuance of the faid Addresses, a compleat Renunciation of a Principle hoftile to the Rights of Ireland, and of all the Claims contained in the faid Statute; and as fuch we will accept it and deem it fatisfactory. Thus united by the facred Bond of Freedom, we request our gracious Sovereign to assure our Sister Kingdom, that we will be Sharers in her Fate, standing or f lling with the British Empire.

We humbly beg Leave to express our Gratitude for the Appointment of his Grace the Duke of Portland to the Government of Ireland. Prevented by Situation from enjoying the Prefence of our be nevolent Sovereign, we rejoice in a Viceroy, whole Character affures us that he will faithfully discharge the Duties of his Station.

The Conomy and Retrenchment which your Ma jefty has been gracioufly pleafed both to recommend and practife, will, we humbly hope, be extended to Ireland. Should a more equal Representation of the People be also adopted, our Profperity would be for ever fecured, and your Majefty's Reign most honorably diffinguished in the Annals of Mankind.

We rejoice in the great and fignal Success of your Maj fly's Arms: Every Enemy must yield to the Efforts of a great, a brave, a free, and an united People. Your Majesty's Choice of those whom you have entrusted with the Administration of Public Affairs, gives us the most heart-felt Sa-tisfaction; Public Confidence is revived; and we doubt not but your Majefty's Crown and Empire will fpeedily be raifed to the higheft Pinnacle of Human Glory.

We have ever beheld with Admiration your Ma-jefty's domeftic Virtues. May your Majefty, and the truly great and amiable Partner of your Throne, long, long live to blefs each other : May the Off-fpring of your happy Union reward your parental Fondnefs, by a Diiplay of every Grace and every Virtue : And when, at length, the immutable Law of Nature shall demand that Tribute, which even Kings must pay, may your mourning Subjects with one Voice lament, that the great, the benevolent Father of His People is no more.
