Royal Exchange Assurance Office,

London, June 28, 1782.

Whereas an Act has been passed in the present Session of Parliament for charging a Duty on Persons whose Property shall be insured against Loss by Fire; All Persons who have paid their Premiums for more than One Year are by the said Act required to pay the Tax at such Time as the next yearly Payments would become due, or within Fifteen Days after, in case their Policies were Annual Policies, and their Payments had been made for One Year only, otherwise such Policies will be void.

London Assurance Office, Birchin-lane,

July 3, 1782.

BY Virtue of an Act of Parliament lately passed, charging a yearly Duty of 1s. 6d. for every 100l. assured from Loss by Fire; all Persons who stand assured by this Corporation for more than One Year are to make the Payment of the said Duty within Seven Days from the Day and Month of the Date of their Policies, otherwise such Policies will be void.

N. B. By the Construction of the Act, Persons whose Policies are dated between the 1st Day of January and the 24th Day of June, in any Year, need not pay the above Duty till the Year 1783, within Fifteen Days from the Day and Month of their Policy.
