At the General Quarter Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at the Guildhall within the said City, on Monday the First Day of July in the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain, &c. before Sir William Plomer, Knight, Mayor of the City of London, Robert Alfop, Esquire, Frederick Bull, Esquire, Aldermen of the said City, James Adair, Serjeant at Law, Recorder of the said City, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King within the said City, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespases, and other Misdemeanors, committed within the said City.

BE it remembered, That the Inspector of Corn Returns hath, in open Court, presented and delivered to the Lord Mayor, Recorder and Aldermen, assembled at this present Session, a certain Book, into which the States or Accounts of the General Aggregate Quantities, Prices, and Average Prices of English Wheat, Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Malt, Bigg and Oats, bona fide sold and delivered, between the 30th Day of March and the 22d Day of June now last past, by each and every Cornfactor dealing by Commission in the Sale of Corn or Grain in the Corn-Exchange, London, have been made up, formed, computed and distinguished, and fairly and properly inserted; and hath verified upon his Oath, that the same have been fairly, correctly, and properly made up, formed and computed, to the best of his Power, Skill and Judgment, and according, so far as in him lay, to the true Intent and Tenor of the Act of Parliament in that Behalf: And the General Average Prices of each of the said respective Sorts of Corn and Grain thereby appearing to the said Lord Mayor, Recorder, and Aldermen, they do hereby, in Pursuance of the said Act, deem and certify the same to be as follow, viz.

**Westminster Fire Office, Bedford-Street,
 July 8, 1782.**

WHEREAS by an Act passed this present Session of Parliament, it is enacted, That all Persons insuring their Property against Loss by Fire, shall pay a Duty after the Rate of One Shilling and Sixpence per Annum for every Hundred Pounds insured from and after the 24th Day of June last.

And it further enacts, That all Policies issued before the 24th Day of June, and granted for any Term of Years, shall be chargeable with the said Duty for so much of the said Term, as on the said 24th Day of June, was to come and unexpired.

This is therefore to give Notice to all Persons insured in this Office, that they are required by the said Act to pay the said Duty at this Office, on the Day of the Date of their Policies, or within Fifteen Days thereof, otherwise the Policies will be void.
