now opened, of having the Sword sheathed, and that Brother will no more rife against Brother.

As Irishmen, we particularly rejoice in the Justice and Liberality of your Majesty's Intentions to-wards this Kingdom: We return your Majesty our most warm and grateful Thanks for having placed over us a Chief Governor whose Hereditary Principles deserve Confidence; whose uniform Support of the Liberty of the People, commands Esteem; our Hearts beat high at the Name of Portland, the po pular Governor of the People of Ireland: We truft, in his Administration, that the Designs of your Majedy, wheel 6 of Miles jesty, whose first Wish is to promote the Happiness of all your Majesty's Subjects, will be perfected; that every Species of Persecution, for Religious Opinions, will be done away, when every equally good Subject will be equally cherished and protected

by the State.

That He who weigheth the Nations in a Balance may direct the Heart of your Majesty, and superintend your Councils, that He may grant Victory to your Fleets and Armies over the antient Enemies of Freedom and these Kingdoms, and that Discord, Enmity, and War, may foon give Place to Public Tranquility, Peace, and Love, is our most ardent Wish and constant Prayer.
