*Extract of a Letter from Captain Jacob Waller, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop Racehorse, to Mr. Stephens, dated July 28, 1782.*

**O**N the 26th Instant, at Eight o'Clock in the Morning, the High Land of Arundel N. E. by N. about Five Leagues, we saw a Schooner steering in for the Land; chased and came up with her, Dunnose Point East Four Leagues, about Four o'Clock in the Afternoon: She proved to be a French Privateer, named Le Vipere, of 10 Guns, (Four-pounders) and Thirty-seven Men, commanded by Michael Ladri Vencent Menage, Eight Days from Dunkirk, had taken nothing since she failed from thence.
