WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That Two Barns, standing on the Farm of John Dines, in the Parish of King's Walden in the County of Hertford, were, in the Night of Wednesday the 2d Day of this instant April, maliciously set on Fire and burnt down, by some Person or Persons unknown:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in setting Fire to the said Barns, is hereby pleased to promise His Most Gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually set Fire thereto) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby promised to any Accomplice, (except as before excepted) or other Person making such Discovery as aforesaid; such Reward to be paid by the said John Dines, of King's Walden aforesaid, or by Mr. Benjamin Rooke, of Hertford, on Conviction of the Offender or Offenders, over and beside any other Reward the Party may be entitled to by any Act of Parliament, or any Reward offered by any Association.

WHEREAS William Wynne Ryland stands charged before the Right Hon. the Lord Mayor, on Suspicion of feloniously and falsely making, forging and counterfeiting an Acceptance to two Bills of Exchange, for Payment of 7114l. and for publishing the same as true, well knowing them to have been so falsely made and counterfeited, with Intent to cheat and defraud the United East-India Company.

He is about Fifty Years of Age, about Five Feet Nine Inches high, wears a Wig, with a Club or Cue, and his own Hair turned over in Front; a black Complexion, thin Face, with strong Lines; his common Countenance very grave, but whilst he speaks rather smiling, and shows his Teeth, and has great Affability in his Manner.
