By the latest Accounts from Calabria and Messina, the Earthquakes seem to continue at Intervals, but with less Violence in Calabria than at Messina, where, on the 14th Instant, the Shock was so violent as to overthrow Part of the Mole which forms the Port; and it is now apprehended that the Port is in Danger of being totally ruined.

The Terror and Confusion seem to be so general in Calabria, that no one has yet sent a clear Account of the numerous Disasters that have afflicted and are still afflicting that unfortunate Province; and

it is now feared that the Mortality will prove to have been still more considerable than was lately supposed.
