

Partici, April 8. By the last Accounts from Calabria Ultra and Messina, it appears, that the Earthquake, slightly felt here and at Naples the 28th of last Month, had been very severe in those Parts, and at the same Hour; most of the Houses in Calanzaro, Cofenza, and several other Towns in Calabria, which had till then escaped, having been thrown down. The Mortality, however, was not great, as the Inhabitants of the Countries afflicted by the Earthquake have for some Time past quitted their Houses, and lived chiefly in Tents or Huts.
