P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed this Session, intituled, "An Act for preventing certain Instruments from being required from Ships belonging to the United States of America, and to give to His Majesty, for a limited Time, certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the said United States," it is amongst other Things enacted, That during the Continuance of the said Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to give such Directions and to make such Regulations with respect to Duties, Drawbacks or otherwise, for carrying on the Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, and the People and Territories of the said United States, as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary, any Law, Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and direct, That Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Hemp, and Flax, Masts, Yards, and Bowsprits, Staves, Heading, Boards, Timber, Shingles, and all other Species of Lumber; Horses, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions; Peas, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain, being the Growth or Production of any of the United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported by British Subjects in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subject, and navigated according to Law, from any Port of the United States of America, to any of His Majesty's West India Islands; and that Rum, Sugar, Melasses, Coffee, Cocoa Nuts, Ginger, and Pimento, may, until further Order, be exported by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of His Majesty's West India Islands, to any Port or Place within the said United States, upon Payment of the same Duties on Exportation, and subject to the like Rules, Regulations Securities and Restrictions, as the same Articles by Law are or may be subject and liable to, if exported to any British Colony or Plantation in America:—And the Right Honourable the Lords

Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That in the Night of Saturday last, or early on Sunday Morning, the Dwelling House of Thomas James, Esq; at Cuper's Bridge, Lambeth, Surry, was burglariously broken open, and the following Articles, among other Things, were stolen thereout, viz. a Lady's old fashioned chased Gold Watch, with a Lady's Mural Gold Chain and a Gold Seal, a Silver Watch; a Brilliant Diamond Cluster Ring, and Two other Diamond Rings; Two Black Shagreen Cases containing Mourning Rings, some of an old and some of a late Date; a large Metal Snuff Box, Two small Silver Patch Boxes, One with the Letters S P, the other with a Coat of Arms on the Bottom; sundry 6s. 9d. and 5s. 3d. Pieces; One Pair of Chased Gadroon Silver Salts on Three Feet; One Silver Pint Mug; Four Silver Table Spoons marked GPI; Nine Silver Tea Spoons, and One Pair of Sugar Tongs; One Silver Pepper Castor; Five Silver Cruet and Castor Tops; Three Silver old-fashioned Wine Labels, Port, Mountain, and White Wine; One Plated Hand Candlestick, with a Crest thereon, viz. a Swan erect, issuing out of a Ducal Coronet; the same Crest was on Five of the Tea Spoons, and on Part of the above Plate.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in breaking open and robbing the Dwelling-house as above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most Gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his, her or their Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Crimes, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
