been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Pool, except as before excepted, shall be aired in fome Place between Woodend and Saltash in the River Tamer : All fuch Goods as shall be imported to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall be aired in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth: All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall be aired at a Place called the Mother Bank, near Portsmouth. And all such Goods as shall be imported to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstones, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anftruther, Prefton Pans, Dundee, Perth, Mon-trofe, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Inverkeithing Bay: And all fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Weftern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltown, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stransaer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Lamlash in the Island of Arran : And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernefs, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnefs, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Frith: And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the South-West Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith. And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jersey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coast of the faid Island called Belle Croute, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are imported, shall repetively perform their Quarantine : And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them or any Part of them, or any of them, shall be aired in a Place near the Island of Guernsey, called the Little Road, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are im ported, shall respectively perform their Quarantine.

That whatfoever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Veffel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Vessel, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from the Goods and Merchandizes before enu merated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine,

That the Captains of every of His Majefty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, fhall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majelty's Cuftoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majeity's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majelty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tything-Men, and all other Officers and Ministers of Juffice, be aiding and affitting to the faid Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Of-fice of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective lsles of Jersey, Gueinsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. T having been reprefented to His Majesty, that feveral Persons who formerly obtained Orders from His Majesty in Council for Grants of Land in the Province of Nova Scotia, have not proceeded to locate and furvey the Lands directed to be granted to them by fuch Orders, but have, in many Irstances, fold and transferred them to others, who have also delayed to carry them into Execution, to the great Injury of His Majesty's Revenue of Quit Rents, and Retardment of the Cultivation and Improvement of the faid Province: His Majesty is thereupon pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke and make void (and doth hereby revoke and make void) all Orders made by His Mas jefty in Council for the Grant of Lands in the Province of Nova Scotia, which bear Date prior to the 1ft of January, 1774, and have not yet been carried into Execution : And His Majesty is hereby further pleafed to order, that the Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being of His Majefty's Province of Nova Scotia, do forbear to iffue any Order of Survey to the Surveyor-General of Lands in the faid Province, or to pass any Grants under the Seal of that Province, of to pais any Grants under the deat of that Province, of any Lot or Parcel of Land within the taid Province, in Purfuance of any Order made by His Majefly in Council, which bears Date prior to the 1ft Day of January, 1774: And that this Majefly's Order in Council be published in The Lorder Council to the Fad that all Be do The London Gazette, to the End that all Perfons concerned may have due Notice thereof.
