Tax on the Registry of Burials, Marriages, Births and Christenings.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in Pursuance of an Act of the last Session of Parliament for granting a Stamp Duty on the Registry of Burials, Marriages, Births, or Christenings, which commences the 2d of October next, the said Register Books may now be stamped at this Office with the Duty required; or the Commissioners will, if such be the Option of the Parties applying, grant Licences for making the said Entries, without the Stamps being marked thereon, on Security being given for the Payment of the said Duty.

And for the Convenience of the Clergy resident in the Country, the Head Distributors of Stamps in the several Counties where such Registers are kept will also be empowered to grant Licences in like Manner; upon Application to them for that Purpose.

THE Commissioners appointed by Act of Parliament for enquiring into the Losses, &c. of the American Loyalists being assembled for the Purpose of carrying the Act into Execution, request such Persons as intend to make Claims, to state their Cases fully, by Way of Memorial, and to deliver the same at Mr. Forster's Chambers, No. 7, King's Bench Walks, Inner Temple, any Day (Sundays excepted) between the Hours of Ten and Two o'Clock, until the 29th of September; and afterwards at the Office of the Commissioners in Lincoln's-inn-fields.
