

LONDON.

At the General Quarter Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at the Guildhall within the said City, on Monday the Twenty-seventh Day of October, in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain, &c. before Nathaniel Newnham, Esq; Mayor of the City of London, James Adair, one of His Majesty's Serjeants at Law, Recorder of the said City, John Hart, Esquire, Henry Kitchen, Esquire, Aldermen of the said City, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King within the said City, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespasses, and other Misdemeanors, committed within the said City.
