and carried off to Sea.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the aforesaid Rose to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of FIFIY POUNDS to any Permise a Reward of the Apprehend or cause to be appreion or Persons who shall apprehend or cause to be apprebended the faid Roje, so that he may be taken before a Magistrate and committed for the said Offence; to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs

upon Conviction.
