WHEREAS a Dutch Ship called the *Margaritta Johanna*, was captured by Rear Admiral Rowley, and Ten Ships of the Line under his Command, on his Way from the Leeward Islands to Jamaica, and brought into the Harbour of Port Royal, in the Beginning of August, 1780, and condemned in the Court of Vice-Admiralty of that Island, which Decree was afterwards reversed by the Commissioners of Appeal at Home, and the Vessel and Cargo, or the Value thereof, ordered to be restored to the Owners or Proprietors: And whereas many of the Officers and Privates belonging to those Ships, may be still unacquainted with the Reversal of the Decree in this Cause, I think it necessary to give this Public Notice, that the Money arising from the Sales (in my Possession) was paid over to the Agents of the Dutch Claimants in Jamaica, by Order of the Court of Vice-Admiralty, as soon as the Exemption of the Judgment at Home, reversing the Decree, was made public there.
