The King has also been pleased to grant the Dignity of a Baron of the Kingdom of Great Britain to the Right Honourable Thomas Viscount Bulkeley, of the Kingdom of Ireland, and the Heirs Male of his Body lawfully begotten, by the Name, Stile and Title of Lord Bulkeley, Baron of Beaumaris, in the County of Anglesey.

The King has also been pleased to grant the like Dignity of Baron of the Kingdom of Great Britain to the several Gentlemen following, and the respective Heirs Male of their Bodies lawfully begotten, by the Names, Stiles and Titles undermentioned, viz.

Noel Hill, Esq; Baron Berwick, of Attingham, in the County of Salop; and

James Dutton, Esq; Lord Sherborne, Baron of Sherborne, in the County of Gloucester.
