A S several Artificers and Manusasturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Ma. nufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Expor-ation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute & George I. Chap. 27.

other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreigh Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Selfions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS. or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Ma-jesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain,' in the Country where such Aitificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by fuch Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Person shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majelty's Use, and shall be deemed Alen, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforefaid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Sesfions: And if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artiscer shall be convicted upon Indistment of any such Preparation to go any such Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court thall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the fame shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indrament in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Beach IF any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireapy Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or land; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any discer contracted with, or seduced, for seit FIVE at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Ar-HUNDRED
