By the KING, A PROCLAMATION,

For Difcovering and Apprehending any of the Persons, who omple Sixteened Pay of Jaly Jaft, and on the Second of this instant August, were concerned in unlawfully Oppoling, Refilting, and Firing at the Officers employed in His Majesty's Revenue, while in the Execution of their Duty, at Deal in the County of Kent.

THEREAS it has been reprefented to Us, That on the Sixteenth Day of July laft, a great Number of diforderly Perfons, armed with Fire Arms, affembled themfelves at the North End of Deal in Our County of Kent, and being fo assembled and armed, forcibly obstructed, refisted, and fired upon the Crews of the Boats acting under the Orders of Lieutenant Bray, in Pursuit of a Galley rowed with Six Oars, contrary to the Statute in that Cale made and provided: And whereas it has also been represented to Us, that on the Second Day of August last, a great Num-ber of diforderly Persons, armed with Fire Arms, affembled themfelves at Deal aforefaid, and forci-bly obstructed the Officers and Men of the Boats belonging to the Ship Scout, acting under the Orders of Captain Lindfay, and endeavouring to feize a Lugger, suspected of carrying on illicit Trade; and that William Russel, a Seaman be-longing to the Scout, was, by some Person or Perfons to armed and affembled, that in the Execu-tion of his Duty: We therefore, being deeply fenfible of the many mifchievous Confequences. that muft inevitably enfue to the Peace of Our Kingdom, the Collection of the Publick Revenue, and the Lives of Our loving Subjects, from fuch wicked and daring Outrages, if they shall go unpunished, and in order to deter all others from committing the like for the future, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby firicitly charge and command all Magistrates, and other Civil Officers whatsoever, and all other Our Subjects, to be aiding and affifting, to the utmost of their Power, in suppressing such illegal and tumultuous Affemblies, and in detecting, apprehending, and bringing to Jultice, the Perfons concerned in infligating the fame, and guilty of any of the Violences before mentioned : And We do hereby promife and declare, That if any Perfon or Perfons concerned in tumultuoufly and forcibly refifting and abstructing the Officers and Men acting under the Orders of Lieutenant Bray, or Captain Lindfay, on the Sixteenth Day of July, or Second Day of August last, shall, on before the Twentieth Day of October next, and before fuch Perfon or Perfons shall be in Custody for the fame, difcover and apprehend, or caufe to be difcovered and apprehended, any other Per-fon or Perfons who hath or have, or shall have been concerned in any of the faid heinous Offences, so that he, she, or they may be convicted thereof, such Discoverer or Discoverers shall have Our most Gracious Pardon for the faid Offences; and, as a further Encouragement to fuch as shall difcover the faid Offenders, We do hereby further promise and declare, That any Person or Persons not in Cullody as aforesaid, who shall, on or before the faid Twentieth Day of October next, discover and apprehend, or caufe to be difcovered and apprehended, any of the Perfons concerned in the aforefaid tumultuous Affemblies, and forcible Refiftance, fo as he, fhe, or they, may be convicted thereof, fhall have and receive, for every Perfon fo difcovered, apprehended, and convicted, the Sum of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS Sterling; which fuid Sum of Two Hundred Pounds Sterling, for every such Offender to discovered and convicted,

the Lords Commiffioners of Ouf Treafury for the Time being are hereby directed and required to pay : And laftly, We do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Our loving Subjects, that they do use their utmost Diligence and Endeavours, in their several Places and Stations, to find out, discover, and apprehend all such Offenders as aforefaid, upon Pain of Our highest Displeasure.
