A S feweral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or in-Arumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Export-ation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in V'ool, Iron; Steel, Brafs, or other Mctal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artifice- of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and thall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any juch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Frades, thall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perion authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, Sec. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch. Perfon thenceforth minable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Liands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devile or Purchafe; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His MajeRy's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of Peace that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore-faid ; fuch juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it fhall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Contession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courie of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpole aforelaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Antito feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brais, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Gleat Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in .reland; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuster Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fnall be convicted, for Twelve Calandar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cale of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again oriending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufacturers or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall for every Offence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltminfler, or in the Court of Seifion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts, in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, ce for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on goard any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, he publickly fold to the belt Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce fhall be to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who fhall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall for every such Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veilel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain fiall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefiy.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain; or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of
