#### By the KING,

PROCLAMATION, Á. For Recalling and Prohibiting Seamen from Serving Foreign Princes and States.

GEORGE R. HEREAS it hath been reprefented unto Us, That Attempts are made to entice Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects; to enter into the Service of Foreign Princes and States, contrary to their Duty to Us, and without Regard to the perfect Amity now fubfifting between Us and all the other Powers of Europe; We have therefore thought it necessary, by and with the Ad. vice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation ; and co hereby strictly charge and command all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatloever and wherefoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) who may have entered into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, without Our fpecial Licence and Authority in that Behalf here-tofore obtained, that forthwith they and every of them do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw themfelves, depart from, and quit fuch Foreign Services, and return Home to their native Countries : And further We do hereby strictly prohibit and forbid all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever (being Our natu-ral born Subjects) from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from and command them, and every of them, nom henceforth to forbear to enter themfelves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel whatfoever, without Our fpecial Licence first had and obtained in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obedi-ence and exact Conformity: And We do hereby publish and declare, that the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according to the atmost Severities of the Law : And We do hereby declare, that if any fuch Mafters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men (being Our Subjects) shall be taken in any Foreign Service, by the Turks, Algerines, or any others, they shall not be reclaimed by Us as Subjetts of Great Britain.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Nine-teenth Day of November, One thousand feven hundred and eighty-four, in the Twenty-fifth Year of Our Reign.
