The Letters from Smirna of the 1st Instant mention that the Plague had entirely cealed there: But the last Accounts from Tunis bring the difagreeable News that the Contagion continued to rage in that City.

Berlin, April 9:

His Serene Highness the Duke of Brunswick has accepted the Office of Infpector-General of Magdeburgh; Lieutenant-General Lengefeld is appointed Governor of that City, from which Office the Inspectorship is now separated; and Lieutenant-General Gaudi is appointed Inspector of the Prussian Troops in Westphalia.

The Duth Mails will be fent off every Tuesday and Friday as usual, after Twelve at Night by Express.
