The Letters from Smirna of the 1st Instant mention that the Plague had entirely ceased there: But the last Accounts from Tunis bring the disagreeable News that the Contagion continued to rage in that City.

Berlin, April 9:

His Serene Highness the Duke of Brunswick has accepted the Office of Inspector-General of Magdeburgh; Lieutenant-General Lengefeld is appointed Governor of that City; from which Office the Inspectorship is now separated; and Lieutenant-General Gaudi is appointed Inspector of the Prussian Troops in Westphalia.

All Letters for the above Counties, &c. must be put into the Receiving Houses before Six, and into the General Post-Office before Seven o'Clock in the Evening, and the Letters in Return will be delivered at London at the same early Hour every Morning, (except Sundays) as those from Bath and Bristol.

The Dutch Mails will be sent off every Tuesday and Friday as usual, after Twelve at Night by Express.
