be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of Hemp or Iron, and under the fame Rules, Regulations, Refirictions, Penalties and Forfeitures in all Refpects, as fuch Drawbacks are allowed and paid, or are fubject and liable to by Law, upon the Exportation of fuch Hemp and Iron into other Foreign Parts.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence, in Manner abovementioned, and may be landed in this Kingdom; and, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy (except as hereinafter excepted) fuch Tobacco may be warehoused under His Majesty's Locks, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of all the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco, within the Time limited by Law, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Tobacco, at the Time it shall be fo landed, with the fame Allowances for the Payment of fuch farther Duties, and under the like Refirictions and Regulations in all other Refpects, not altered by this Order, as fuch Tobacco is and may be warehoused by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parliament in Force : But it is His Majesty's Pleasure neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Tobacco into the Ports of London, Briftol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or eicher of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all the farther Duties due for such Tobacco, but without any Allowance for prompt Payment of the faid Du:y, commonly called the Old Subfidy, or any other of the Duties which were formerly payable in ready Money; and that if any Tobacco, which has been or thall be fo imported, during the Continuance of this Order, from the Territories of the faid United States, into the faid Ports of London, Briftol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, shall be afterwards taken, within the Time limited, out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be fecured under His Majefty's Locks, in Manner herein before directed, at either of the above-mentioned Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which have been or shall be entered into for Payment of the faid Duties, shall be discharged in the Manner directed by the feveral Acts of Parliament now in Force.

And, for the Purpofe of regulating the Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in the Weit Indies, including in that Defcription the Bahama Iflands, and the Bermuda or Somers Iflands, and the People and Territories belonging to the faid United States of America, His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that no Goods or Commodities whatfoever, except Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Hemp and Flax, Mafts, Yards and Bowfprits, Staves, Heading, Boards, Timber, Shingles, and all other Species of Lumber; Horfes, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provifions; Peafe, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain, being the Growth or Production of any of the faid United States of America, fhall be imported from any of

the faid United States of America, into any of His Majesty's West India Islands, the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somers Islands; and that such Goods may, until further Order, be imported by British Subjects only, and in no other than British built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; and that Rum, Sugar, Melasses, Coffee, Cocoa-Nuts, Ginger and Pimento, may (until further Order) be exported by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned by His Ma- ; jesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the faid Islands to any Port or Place within the faid United States, upon Payment of the fame Duties on Exportation, and fubject to the like Rules, Regulations, Securities and Reffrictions,as the fame Articles by Law are or may be fubject and liable to, if exported to any British Colony or Plantation in America; and the Bonds and Securities heretofore required to be taken for fuch Ships carrying fuch Goods, shall and may be cancelled and discharged, upon the like Certificates as are required by the faid recited Act made in the Twenty third Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, to discharge any Bonds given in Great Britain for the due Landing any other Goods in the faid United States of America.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that no Goods or Commodities, being the Growth or Manufacture of the faid United States, shall be imported into the Provinces of Nova-Scotia, or New Brunswick, and their respective Dependencies, except Horfes, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions; Peafe, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain ; also Lumber of every Sort ; and that the above Articles shall be imported by. British Subjects only, and in none other than Britifh-built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and during fuch limited Times only as the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid: Provinces, and their refpective Dependencies, shall with the Advice of their respective Councils, by Proclamation, declare the Importation of any of the faid Articles to be necessary for the Supply of the Inhabitants of the faid Provinces.

And His Majelty is hereby further pleafed to order, that no Goods or Commodities of the Growth or Manufacture of the faid United States that be imported into any of the Ports of the Province of Quebec.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commillioners of His Majetty's Treasury, and the Lords Commillioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
