And, as a further Encouragement, the faid Mr. Thomas Orrell does bereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Perfon making fuch Difcovery, to be paid upon the Conviction of the Perpetrator or Perpetrators of the faid Robbery and Murder.
