And, as a further Encouragement, the faid Mr. Tho-mas Orrell does hereby promife a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Perfon making fuch Difcovery, to be paid upon the Conviction of the Perpetrator or Perpetrators of the faid Robbery and Murder.

The other Person is about Thirty-fix Years of Age, Five Feet Six or Seven Inches high, thin made, his Face red, wears bis own Hair, and is supposed to be dreffed in a dark-coloured Coat. They had both the Appearance of Farmers, and were feen in London the Evening of the Robbery.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, both or either of the Perfons who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Re-ward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Perfons whether an Accomplice in the faid Robbery or knowing thereof, shall make Difcovery whereby both or either of the Perfons who committed the fame may be apprehendea and brought to Juffice, fuch Difcoverer will, upon Conviction of both or either of the Parties, be entitlea to the fame Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, and will also receive His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.
