*Madrid, November 1.*

Letters from Carthagena in South America give an Account of an Earthquake, which was felt in the City of Santa-Fé on the 12th of July last, at Eight o'Clock in the Morning. Two Churches were entirely destroyed, and many publick and private Buildings greatly damaged. The Shock was felt in the neighbouring Towns and Villages of Yugatava, Caxica, and others, where the Churches have also been left in Ruins. Fortunately the Number of Lives lost appears to have been small. In Santa-Fé the Persons killed amounted only to Fourteen.

The Archbishop, who is likewise Viceroy of Santa-Fé, has made over the whole Revenues of his Diocese for the Relief of the Sufferers, and has received on this Occasion the Thanks of His Catholick Majesty, with Liberty to draw from the Royal Treasury what further Assistance he may judge necessary.
