N the 14th Instant the King of Spain published an Edict, prohibiting, under severe Penalties, the Use of more than Two Horses or Mules in Gentlemen's Carriages, within the different Towns in this Country. A circular Letter has been sent to the Foreign Ministers residing at this Court, with a Copy of the Edict, expressing His Catholick Majesty's Hopes that they will set the Example to the Public, by complying with the new Regulation.

The same Edict a so abolishes the celebrated Bull Feasts (so long the favourite Diversion of the Spaniards) except in particular Cases, where the Profits arising from that Exhibition have been appropriated to pious or patriotic Uses, and where no Fund has yet been set aside to supply the Desiciency that would be the Consequence of the Suppression.

The Motive affigued for these Prohibitions, in the Preamble of the Edict, is the great Destruction of Cattle, which might be better employed in Agriculture, and other useful Occupations.
