St. Petersburg, March 14.

Her Imperial Majesty was pleased to transmit this Day an Ukase, or Imperial Rescript, to the Senate, notifying to that Assembly her Intention of setting out, in the Course of next January, upon a Progress to her newly established Governments of Ekaterinoflaw and the Tauride.

Caserta, March 14.

His Sicilian Majesty has been pleased to name the Prince Caramanico Vice-Roy of Sicily; and Don Tomaso di Somma, His Sicilian Majesty's Envoy at the Court of Vienna, is appointed to succeed the Prince Caramanico with the Character of Ambassador at the Court of France.

The Marquis Gallo, His Sicilian Majesty's Envoy at the Court of Turin, is appointed to succeed Don Tomaso di Somma at the Court of Vienna.

Vienna, March 22.

On Monday last their Royal Highnesses the Archduchess and Duke of Saxe-Teschén set out on their Return to Brussels. As it is their Intention to stop some Days at Coblenz, and afterwards at Bonn, they are not expected to arrive at Brussels before the Middle of next Month.

Dresden, March 26.

Count O'Kelly, lately appointed His Imperial Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at this Court, had this Day his first Audience of the Elector, to deliver his Credentials.

M. de Metzburg, who has resided here, since the Peace of Teschen, in Quality of Chargé d'Affaires from the Court of Vienna, is appointed His Imperial Majesty's Resident in the Provinces of Wallachia and Moldavia.

Bonn, March 30.

Last Week, at the Close of the annual Assembly of the States of this Electorate, it was resolved to constitute a Supreme Council of Revision, for the final Decision of Appeals in all Civil Causes from the ordinary Courts of Justice, and to grant to His Electoral Highness the Sum of Ten Thousand Rix Dollars per Annum for its Support. This Council is to consist of a President and Eight Counsellors, to be named by the Elector.

Whitehall, March 30, 1786.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Friday Evening the 10th of this Instant March, a Fire broke out, between the Hours of Eight and Nine o'Clock, at a Farm, in the Parish of

Long Orton in the County of Huntingdon, in the Occupation of Thomas Shuman, by which a Barn, containing about Forty Quarters of Beans, together with Two Horvets adjoining, and containing about 8½ Quarters of Barley and Twenty Quarters of Beans were totally burnt down and consumed, and also Seven Horvets which were in the Farm-Yard: And whereas there are strong Reasons to suspect that the same were wilfully and maliciously set on Fire by some Person or Persons unknown; His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this atrocious Offence, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the Offenders (except the Person who actually set Fire to the said Barn and Horvets) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence.
