This Day the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Sheriffs, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches from the Mansion-House to Westminster-Hall, the Sword and Mace being carried before them and the City Officers attending, and proceeded directly up to the Exchequer Bar, where the new Lord Mayor did take the Oaths appointed; and having recorded Warrants of Attorney in the proper Courts, they returned in the same Manner to the Mansion-House.
