

ceiving or being in Possession of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That about One o'Clock in the Morning of the 23d of January last, Five Smugglers, mounted with two Castles each, were met by the Supervisor of Excise, of Stalbridge Division, in the County of Dorset; who, with George Coote Tucker, his Assistant, rode up and demanded their Goods, when the Smugglers discharged Five Pistols or Blunderbuffs at them, wounded the Supervisor's and Tucker's Horses; that Tucker having again attacked them, and a Pistol being presented at him by one of the Smugglers, he with a Sword twice struck his Arm, prevented him firing, and, it is supposed, wounded him; that the Smugglers then rode off without leaving the Goods, or the Officers being able to discover who they were.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in assaulting and firing at the Excise Officer and his Assistant as above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His Most Gracious Pardon to any one of them who shall discover his Accomplices therein; so that they, or any of them, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, the Commissioners of Excise do hereby promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons making such Discovery, to be paid by their Secretary on Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
