*Paris, April 10.*

On Sunday Evening His Most Christian Majesty was pleased to remove Monf. de Calonne from the Office of Comptroller-General of the Finances, and on Monday Evening Monf. de Fourqueux, Councillor of State, was appointed to succeed him. His Majesty has also thought proper to dismiss Monf. de Miromesnil from his Office of *Garde des Sceaux*, and Monf. de Lamoignon, one of the Presidents of the Parliament of Paris, is named to succeed him.

Monf. d'Aligre, First President of the Parliament of Paris, has retired.

The Assembly of the *Notables* is adjourned to Monday next.

*Vienna, March 20.*

An Imperial Edict has been published here, dated the 8th Instant, prohibiting the Importation into any of the Austrian Dominions of Hardware, Cutlery, Turnery, Toys, Stationary, Cordage, Whalebone, Leather-Gloves, Ribbons, Cottons, Linens, Watches, Fans, Thread, Sadlery, &c. unless by Individuals for their own Use, and not for Sale; but Cambricks, Gauzes, Mullins and Lawns are permitted to be imported by Passport for Sale, paying a Duty of Six Florins per Pound Weight.

weavers Work is already so Low They Cannot Get A livelywood like Almost any Other Trade, why should you wish To starve Us Quite, Yours Lives As well as Ours are Not Insured One Moment, Neither Can You Carry Your Ill Got Treatment, with you Into The Next Life, As For This life I Look upon It as Nothing in Respect of The life To Come, If you, with Starving The Poor, Could Gain The whole world And at the same Time Greatly Indanger Your Precious soul's, In what Point Have You The Advantage let me Desire of you Gentlemen To Take This Wicked Device Into Consideration, Or Else Prepare your selves For A Good Bonfire at Both Ends At Each Your Dwellings, which Thing is Fully Determined Without An Alteration within This Month, was I sure To Dey For standing For My Right, I would Dey Willingly, But Trust Me In That, I will Trust My self, and not another I May As well Dey with a Houltter, As Be starved To Death, with Wicked Men's Devices, Gentlemen I am determined To Execute The Contents of These lines In Every Degree.”

**AN** Act passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to explain, amend, and render more effectual an Act passed in the Twenty-third, intituled, An Act for authorizing the Treasurer of the Navy to pay the Garrison and Naval Department at Gibraltar the like Bounty for destroying certain Spanish Ships of War as is allowed to the Officers and Men on board any of His Majesty's Ships of War taking or destroying Ships of War belonging to the Enemy;

The Commissioners appointed by virtue of the said Act to inspect, examine and settle all Accounts of such Bounty Money and Prize Money, do hereby give Notice to all Persons claiming Shares of the said Prize Money, That all Claims respecting the same must, and they are hereby required to be delivered into the Board on or before the 1st Day of January, 1788, otherwise they will be excluded from the Benefit of the said Act; and they further give Notice to all Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and private Soldiers who served in the Garrison of Gibraltar at the Time the Spanish Floating Batteries were destroyed, and the St. Miguel Ship of War, taken, who have not received any Share of the Prize Money on Account of their Names being left out of the Prize Lists, to apply at the Office for examining Army Accounts, Dorset-court, Westminster, by Letter or otherwise, and state their Pretensions, in order to their being laid before the Commissioners for their Consideration, on or before the said 1st Day of January, 1788.
