ETTERS from Lemberg, of the 23d of April, mention the fafe Arrival of the Emperor in that City, and that his Imperial Majefty had made a fhort Excursion from thence to Zamosch, in Gallicia, where several new Public Buillings are carrying on, and was returned to Lemberg.

Paris, May 10.

Monf. de Brienne, Archbishop of Toulouse, is appointed Prefident of the Royal Council of Finances, and has taken his Seat in Council as Minister of State. Monf. de Villedeuil succeeds Monf. de Fourqueux, as Comptroller-General; and Meffrs. de Lessart, Desforges, Lambert, and de la Malliere, are appointed Intendants of the Finances.

H IS late Majefty baving been gracioufly pleafed, by His Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th Day of June, 1733, to establish cer-tain Rules and Orders for the Relief of Poor Widows of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy; These are to give Notice, that Copies of the said Rules and Orders are lodged with the Commissioners of His and Orders are lodged with the Commitgioners of His Majefty's Navy at Chatham, Portfmouth, and Ply-mouth; as alfo with the Clerks of the Checque at Deptford, Woolwich, and Sheernefs; and with the Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinfale; where all fuch Widows as intend to bay in their Claims, may be informed of all Particulars which entitle them to the Benefit of the faid Charity, and receive the pro-per Certificates for that Purpofe. But fuch Widows. as live at too great a Distance from the Places aboveas live at too great a Lijsance from the Linces upove-mentioned, may apply, by Letter, to Mr. Thomas Kite; at the Admiralty-Office, who will fend them all nesef-fary Information.
