LETTERS from Lemberg, of the 23d of April, mention the safe Arrival of the Emperor in that City, and that his Imperial Majesty had made a short Excurſion from thence to Zarnofch, in Gallicia, where ſeveral new Public Buillings are carrying on, and was returned to Lemberg.

Paris, May 10.

Monſ. de Brienne, Archbiſhop of Toulouſe, is appointed Preſident of the Royal Council of Finances, and has taken his Seat in Council as Miniſter of State. Monſ. de Villedeuil ſucceeds Monſ. de Fourqueux, as Comptroller-General; and Meſſrs. de Leſſart, Deſorges, Lambert, and de la Malliere, are appointed Intendants of the Finances.

HIS late Maſteſty having been graciously pleaſed, by His Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th Day of June, 1733, to eſtabliſh certain Rules and Orders for the Relief of Poor Widows of Commiſſion and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy; Theſe are to give Notice, that Copies of the ſaid Rules and Orders are lodged with the Commiſſioners of His Maſteſty's Navy at Chatham, Portſmouth, and Plymouth; as alſo with the Clerks of the Cheſque at Deptford, Woolwich, and Sheerneſs; and with the Naval Officers at Harwich, Deal, and Kiſale; where all ſuch Widows as intend to lay in their Claims, may be informed of all Particulars which entitle them to the Benefit of the ſaid Charity, and receive the proper Certificates for that Purpoſe. But ſuch Widows as live at too great a Diſtance from the Places abovementioned, may apply, by Letter, to Mr. Thomas Kite, at the Admiralty-Office, who will ſend them all neceſſary Information. And the Governours of the ſaid Charity, intending to diſtribute to the Widows of Sea Officers, who died before the 30th of Auguſt, 1732, as well as to the Widows of thoſe Officers who died ſince that Time, whoſe Circumſtances come within the Rules
