WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Sunday the 9th Instant, about Two o'Clock in the Morning, a Fire broke out in an Out-House, behind the Dwelling-House of Mr. John Spurrier, Colourman and Pawnbroker, in Fore-street, Limehouse, which consumed the Premises, and the Goods therein, and also burnt the adjoining House, and damaged several others: And whereas it has been further represented, that there is great Reason to suspect that the said Premises were maliciously and wilfully set on Fire, by some evil-disposed Person or Persons unknown, a Man having been seen to climb over a Cistern behind the said Dwelling-House, at the Instant when the Fire was discovered:—

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in setting Fire to the Premises above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually set Fire thereto) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
