**DITTO, Frocks.**

Blue Coat, Blue Lapels and ditto round Cuffs; fall-down Collar; Gold Lace Holes, square at both Ends, Nine Holes in the Lapels by Three's; Two to the Pockets, and Two to the Cuff, none behind; White Lining; Buttons same as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

**MASTERS and COMMANDERS, Full Dress.**

Blue Cloth Coats, with Blue Lapels and ditto round Cuffs, laced with Gold-Lace; the Pocket once laced, and One on the Cuff; Three Buttons to each; stand-up Collar, double laced; White Lining; Buttons as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

**DITTO, Frocks.**

Blue Cloth Coats, with Blue Lapels, round Cuffs, and fall-down Collar; Gold Lace Holes, square at each End, Ten in the Lapels, by Two's; Two to the Pocket, and Two on the Cuff; none behind; White Lining; Buttons as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

**LIEUTENANTS, Full Dress.**

Blue Cloth Coat, with White Lapels and ditto round Cuffs; Holes regular in the Lapels; Three Buttons to the Pocket, and Three on the Cuff; stand-up Collar; White Lining; Buttons same as the Captains:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches.

**Undress.**

Blue Cloth Coat, edged with White Cloth; Blue Lapels and ditto round Cuffs; Three Buttons to the Pockets and Cuffs; stand-up Collar; Buttons as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches.
