 Two Trumpets, with same Arms as on Second Horse.  
 Pursuivant, with Banner Rolls, Scarf, &c.  
 The Standard, with the Order of Saint Patrick on a Lance, carried by a Captain supported by Two Lieutenants.  
 Second Mourning Horse, as above, with Arms of Saint Patrick.  
 Twelve Servants of the Household in Mourning, Scarfs, &c. Two and Two.  
 Pursuivant Messengers in Ditto, Two and Two.  
 Two State Trumpets, with his Grace's full Arms in the Escutcheons to Trumpets, and Four to each Horse.  
 Yeomen Ushers, with Scarfs and Hatbands, &c.  
 Gentlemen at large, Ditto.  
 Gentleman Usher Assistant.  
 Pursuivant, with Banner Rolls.  
 Officers of the Order of Saint Patrick;
